admiral ted makes out in public

The third rehearsal of Admiral Ted Brinkley (semi-ret.) and the Electric Florid-Ians took place July 6 at the Make-Out Room. An ensemble so large that the audience was pretty much forced to attend another show at another venue due to lack of space. Those who stayed enjoyed expert work in the "Chartist" tradition: combining, as advertised, original compositions yanking from Brixton to

The evening kicked off with Polly Moller and her piece 'Three Swords'. The structure of the work was driven by Polly flipping over Tarot cards, which informed her improv sections, played on either flute, bass flute, ocarina, or derivatives thereof. The music itself centered around the breath - the way she connected with the instrument, made it greater than just the sum. In the middle, she diverged into the "Autopsy of the Heart" - literally a recitation of an autopsy report on a human heart. Perhaps a bit too heavy of a metaphor, but bold nonetheless.

Next up was Theresa Wong, cello and voice, and Kanoko Nishi, koto. The two were clearly well-coordinated. The sounds wove in and out very organically: a screeching which had its genesis on koto w/ styrofoam was picked up by voice, then morphed into a cello ostinato. A theme one woman started was picked up by the other and evolved between both.

The 'toys' used on the prepared koto (picnic plates, combs, bow) added energy and a visual flair, but sometimes didn't advance the sonic palette, leaving the koto's natural uniqueness underutilized. But when they meshed, and tapped into an original sound, it was magical.

The evening was capped by the duo Jen Baker (trombone) and Lisa Mezzacappa (double bass). Another well-oiled kinetic machine. Perhaps the most 'traditional' and jazzy of the evening's sets, they presented the gamut from wild improv to hints of a groove. Most of the pieces were fairly short, which helped keep things focused and flowing, and lent even more impact to the wide range of styles they presented.

Props to Jim Ryan for curating this lineup. This show marked the end of the series at the Compound Gallery in Oakland, hopefully another season lies in the future. ❖
